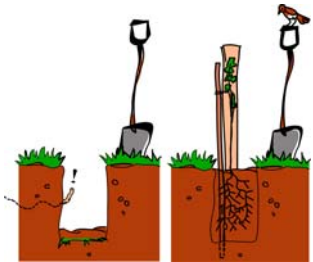

HEDGE AND COPSE PACK

Schools can receive a free hedge or hazel copse pack to plant in their school grounds. The first 1,000 to register online will receive 30 native trees, enough for a small grove or short length of hedge. The pack arrives to your door by post and comes with planting instructions and complementary educational resources. Also open to youth groups.
